

Biographies



Steven M. Zielke, (artistic director and conductor) Dr. Zielke is the Patricia Valian Reser Professor of Music at Oregon State University where he serves as director of choral studies and teaches choral conducting and choral music pedagogy. He earned his doctoral and master's degrees in choral conducting from The Florida State University and held the prestigious Clayton Krehbiel Fellowship, funded through the generous efforts of the late Robert Shaw.



Raymund Ocampo (associate conductor) received a master's in choral conducting from the University of South Florida and served as the Bonita L. Bass Memorial assistant conductor for the Master Chorale of Tampa Bay. He received his bachelor's in music education from Concordia College where he studied with Dr. René Clausen and Dr. Paul Nesheim. He currently serves as music program chair and director of choral studies at Linn-Benton Community College.



Nicola Nine Zielke (collaborative piano) is the assistant director and vocal coach of the Oregon State University Chamber Choir. Nine, a mezzo soprano, is also a member of Oregon State University voice faculty and teaches German diction. Originally from Boise, Idaho, Nicola holds degrees in music from Friends University and the Wichita State University. An active performer, Nine is the resident collaborative pianist and vocal coach for the Corvallis Repertory Singers.



Sandra Babb (soprano soloist) is associate professor of choral music education at Oregon State University, where she teaches choral methods, vocal pedagogy, and choral conducting. She also directs OSU Bella Voce and the University Chorale, as well as the Heart of the Valley Chamber and Children's Choirs. Babb received her bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees in music education from Florida State University and is a National Center for Voice and Speech certified vocologist.



Melissa Reed (soprano soloist) is a choir teacher and singer based in Hillsboro, Oregon. She completed degrees from Oregon State University (B.S. Music '14 and M.A.T. Music Education '15) before beginning her teaching career in Roseburg, Oregon. She currently teaches middle and high school choir in Hillsboro, and a mom to 3-year-old daughter, Amelia. Melissa is a member of the Oregon Repertory Singers and is often featured as a soprano soloist.



Emilia Veremchuk (mezzo-soprano soloist) holds a bachelor's in music education and vocal performance, and a master's in music education from Oregon State University. While at OSU, she studied voice with Nicola Nine Zielke. She also participated in, and served as assistant director for both Bella Voce, under the direction of Dr. Sandra Babb, and the Chamber Choir, under the direction of Dr. Steven Zielke. In OSU's production of *Chess*, she played the lead role, Florence. Emilia currently teaches choir and guitar at Cheldelin Middle School in Corvallis.



Steven Evans-Renteria (tenor soloist) is a vocalist and actor based out of Corvallis, Oregon. With a voice described as "divinely sweet," (*Oregon Arts Watch*). Steven has been called upon to be a soloist with both opera companies and various concert ensembles in Oregon, Ohio, Germany, Czechnia, and in Los Angeles. Noteworthy roles include Nemorino (*L'Elisir d'Amore*), Nicely-Nicely Johnson (*Guys and Dolls*), and Gangster no.1(*Kiss Me Kate*). Currently, he is working on his undergraduate degree at Oregon State University.



Michael Eclevia (bass-baritone soloist) is a senior at Oregon State University studying music. At OSU his performance credits include Gobin in Puccini's opera, *La rondine*, Ned Rorem's *Our Town*, Gamekeeper/Hunter in Dvorak's *Rusalka*, and recently as Ivan Molokov in *Chess*. He has sung with the OSU Chamber Choir, OSU Meistersingers, and University Chorale, and previously worked as a choral scholar for Good Samaritan Episcopal Church.
