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

An active performer, Nine is the resident collaborative pianist and vocal coach for the Corvallis Repertory Singers.



**Taylor Hulett** (soprano soloist) is an Oregon State University alumna with a bachelor's in music in vocal performance and choral music education. This June, Taylor earned her master's in vocal performance from Portland State University. Last December, Taylor performed as the soprano soloist in Handel's *Messiah* with Corvallis Repertory Singers. Recently, she's performed the role of Alice Ford in Portland State University's spring opera production of *The Merry Wives* 

of Windsor. Currently, Taylor sings with the Westminster Presbyterian Chancel choir, works in the North Clackamas School District and performs with Queer Opera at Portland State.
