Biographies

Steven M. Zielke, (artistic director and conductor) Dr. Zielke is the Patricia Valian Reser Professor of Music at Oregon State University where he serves as director of choral studies and teaches choral conducting and choral music pedagogy. He earned his doctoral and master's degrees in choral conducting from The Florida State University and held the prestigious Clayton Krehbiel Fellowship, funded through the generous efforts of the late Robert Shaw.

Raymund Ocampo (associate conductor) received a master's in choral conducting from the University of South Florida and a bachelor's in music education from Concordia College where he studied with Dr. René Clausen and Dr. Paul Nesheim. He currently serves as music program chair and director of choral studies at Linn-Benton Community College. Mr. Ocampo founded and served as artistic director of "ascend," an 8-member vocal ensemble dedicated to performing new works in a unique way.

Nicola Nine Zielke (collaborative piano) is the assistant director and vocal coach of the Oregon State University Chamber Choir. Nine, a mezzo soprano, is also a member of Oregon State University voice faculty and teaches German diction. Originally from Boise, Idaho, Nicola holds degrees in music from Friends University and Wichita State University. An active performer, Nine is the resident collaborative pianist and vocal coach for the Corvallis Repertory Singers.

Madelyn Zuro (soprano) is a passionate performer and music educator based in Vancouver, Washington. From her 4th grade choir class to Oregon State University's Chamber Choir, she always enjoyed singing with others. At OSU, she performed soprano solos with OSU's Bella Voce and Chamber Choir. After completing her bachelor's in music, she joined the Oregon Chorale, followed by the Choral Arts Ensemble of Portland (CAE), where she was a soloist on multiple works. A versatile vocalist, she also enjoys singing in just about any style, taking particular delight in pop and jazz.

Jenna Skarphol (mezzo-soprano) is a voice teacher and opera performer in the mid-Willamette Valley. She holds a bachelor's degree in music from Oregon State, and a master's degree from the University of Northern Iowa. She's performed with the Corvallis Repertory Singers, Willamette Valley Symphony, Portland Opera in the Park, Lark Opera, Opera Bend, and Mid-Valley Musical Theater. Recent roles include La Voix from Offenbach's "Les contes d'Hoffmann" and Dorabella from Mozart's "Cosi fan tutte," Hänsel from Humperdinck's "Hänsel und Gretel" and Flosshilde from Wagner's "Das Rheingold."

Bryce Tomlin (tenor) has appeared in operas with Arizona Opera as a principal artist, and is an active soloist for recitals and concerts with Willamette Master Chorus and Corvallis Repertory Singers. He received his bachelor's degree in music education from OSU, and served as assistant conductor of OSU's Meistersingers. He holds a master's degree in music with an emphasis in vocal performance from the University of Arizona. In Arizona he also worked as a full-time staff singer at St. Philips in the Hills Episcopal Church and voice instructor for undergraduate music majors. Currently, Bryce is the director of music at Chemeketa Community College, as well as the director of music ministries at Queen of Peace Catholic Church.

Paul Denison (bass-baritone) is currently working and studying at OSU and will graduate with a bachelor's in music vocal performance in the spring of 2025. While at OSU, Paul's performed as a featured soloist with the OSU Chamber Choir in Handel's "Te Deum" and "Jubilate," and Vivaldi's "Magnificat." Paul also serves as the assistant conductor of the First Congregational Church Choir, and has acted as bass section leader in the Meistersingers, Chamber Choir, and the Corvallis Repertory Singers. As part of OSU's opera workshop program, Paul performed scenes from "Carmen," "La Traviata," "Don Giovanni," and "La Boheme." In 2023, Paul performed the role of Frank in a production of Johann Strauss's "Die Fledermaus."
